I. Programs

1. Interdisciplinary Program of Life and Environmental Sciences (First-Year Admission)

Academic Objectives	This course, in which students are able to earn an academic degree through classes conducted only in English, aims to provide students with a firm foundation and specialized knowledge in the field of life and environmental sciences. Students will become global citizens who can contribute to the resolution of global issues pertaining to the environment, energy, and food from both regional and international perspectives.
Admissions Policy	1. General Qualifications Students with academic interests in various issues involving the life phenomena of living things and ecological systems, global environment, and sustainable usage of agro-biological resources, who possess the applicable skills to analyze events from a variety of perspectives, are sought for this program. 2. Student Evaluation and Selection The university will make a comprehensive evaluation of applicants based on each student's English proficiency and basic academic ability to acquire knowledge in their major fields of study. In addition, their own unique perspective and analytical ability to resolve various problems in life and environmental sciences, based on the submitted documents and individual interviews, will be considered.

III. Application Requirements

First-Year Admission

A. Applicant Eligibility

Persons who fall under any one of the categories 1 through 5 are eligible.

1. Persons who have completed or are expected to complete a 12-year curriculum of formal school education (*1) in a country other than Japan by August 31, 2027
2. Persons who have completed or are expected to complete a 12-year curriculum in Japan at an international school designated by the Minister of MEXT (*2) by August 31, 2027
3. Persons who hold or are expected to hold an International Baccalaureate, European Baccalaureate, Abitur (Germany), Baccalauréat (France), or GCE A-Level/International A-Level (United Kingdom) (*3) by August 31, 2027
4. Persons who have completed or are expected to complete a 12-year curriculum at a school accredited by WASC (Western Association of Schools and Colleges), CIS (Council of International Schools), ACSI (Association of Christian Schools International), NEASC (New England Association of Schools and Colleges), Cognia, or COBIS (Council of British International Schools) by August 31, 2027
5. Among those who do not fall under any one of the categories 1 to 4 above, those who take the individual eligibility screening conducted by the university and are regarded as eligible to apply for the program

*1. Persons from an **international school** might not fall under the eligibility criteria 1 above. Please ask "XI. Contact Desk" in case you are not sure if you are eligible to apply for the program or not.

*3. For the GCE A-Level/International A-Level, applicants must complete three or more Advanced Level subjects at grade E or above.

First-Year Admission

B. Individual Eligibility Screening

Applicants who fall under item 5 of the above section A. Applicant Eligibility must undergo an individual eligibility screening prior to application. Please submit your request by September 30, 2026. If you wish to apply or are unsure whether the screening is necessary, please contact the XI. Contact Desk by email.

C. Conditions for Application

Conditions for application include a recommendation by the school principal or similar person, and an English test score such as TOEFL, TOEIC, IELTS, or an equivalent test.

- English Test

The required English levels are as follows:

- TOEFL (iBT):

- [For tests taken before January 20, 2026] 61 or higher;

- [For tests taken on or after January 21, 2026] 3.5 or higher

- TOEIC (Listening & Reading): 600 or higher

- IELTS (Academic): 5.0 or higher

*Applicants whose language of instruction at the high school (upper secondary) level was English for three years, including the final year, are not required to submit any English test scores.

D. Application Fees

JPY17,000 in total

- You need to pay JPY4,000 via the application system when applying.
- If you pass the first-stage screening, you need to pay JPY13,000 via the application system for the second-stage screening.

Transfer Admission

A. Applicant Eligibility

Persons who fall under any one of the categories 1 through 3 are eligible.

1. Persons who have completed or are expected to complete a degree at a non-Japanese university or college in either biological sciences, agro-biological resource sciences, agriculture, geoscience, or a related discipline by August 31, 2027
2. Persons who have been enrolled at a non-Japanese four-year university in either biological sciences, agro-biological resource sciences, agriculture, geoscience, or a related discipline for at least two years by August 31, 2027, and have completed or are expected to complete at least 62 credits
3. Persons who have been enrolled in a program taught in English at a Japanese four-year university in either biological sciences, agro-biological resource sciences, agriculture, geoscience, or a related discipline for at least two years by August 31, 2027, and have completed or are expected to complete at least 62 credits

* A “program taught in English at a Japanese university” is defined as a program where students can earn credits through classes taught in English.

* Applicants are required to have completed at least 14 years of school education by the time of admission.

* One credit equals 15 hours of lectures and seminar or 30 hours of experiments and practical trainings.

B. Conditions for Application

Conditions for application include a recommendation by the school principal or similar person, and an English test score such as TOEFL, TOEIC, IELTS, or an equivalent test.

The required English levels are as follows:

College of Biological Sciences and College of Geoscience

- TOEFL (iBT):

[For tests taken before January 20, 2026] 75 or higher;

Transfer Admission

[For tests taken on or after January 21, 2026] 4.0 or higher

- TOEIC (Listening & Reading): 700 or higher
- IELTS (Academic): 5.5 or higher

College of Agro-Biological Resource Sciences

- TOEFL (iBT):

[For tests taken before January 20, 2026] 80 or higher;

[For tests taken on or after January 21, 2026] 4.0 or higher

- TOEIC (Listening & Reading): 750 or higher
- IELTS (Academic): 6.0 or higher

*Applicants whose language of instruction at the high school (upper secondary) or higher levels was English for three years including the final year are not required to submit any English test scores.

C. Application Fees

JPY30,000 in total

- You need to pay JPY7,000 via the application system when applying.
- If you pass the first-stage screening, you need to pay JPY23,000 via the application system for the second-stage screening.

IV. Selection Method

Admissions screening procedures consist of two selection stages. Only those who passed the first stage can proceed to the second stage.

A. First-Stage Screening

The submitted documents (qualification certificate, official transcript, English test score, reference letter, study plan, and other supporting documents) will be comprehensively evaluated.

The use of generative AI (Artificial Intelligence) in any application form is strictly prohibited.

B. Second-Stage Screening

Individual interviews will be conducted via Zoom or other teleconferencing system for applicants who have passed the first-stage screening. The interview will be used for an overall evaluation of the applicant's English abilities, capability to acquire basic academic knowledge in the applicant's major fields of study, and desire to contribute to life and environmental sciences.

The use of generative AI (Artificial Intelligence) is strictly prohibited.

* The University of Tsukuba is not liable for any technical issues or connectivity problems that may arise during the interview process from the applicant's end, and all necessary arrangements should be made by the applicant to ensure a smooth and uninterrupted connection.

V. Application Procedures

A. How to Apply

1. Create your account for the application system
 - Access "University of Tsukuba English Programs Online Application" and create your account.

2. Enter the necessary information
 - Enter the necessary information following the instructions in the application system.
3. Submit the "documents prepared by the applicant"
 - Submit the necessary documents following the instructions in the application system.
 - Please refer to "VI. Application Documents" for details.
4. Submit the "documents prepared by a person other than the applicant"
 - "Documents prepared by a person other than the applicant" refer to documents submitted by a third party at the applicant's request through the application system. Please follow the

instructions in the application system to submit your request.

- Please note that the “documents prepared by a person other than the applicant” must be submitted within the application period, as are “documents prepared by the applicant”. Applicants are advised to send their requests as early as possible.

5. Make a payment of examination fee

- Make a payment for the first-stage screening (JPY4,000 for first-year admissions, and JPY7,000 for transfer admissions) via the application system. Payments can be made by credit card only.

*Administrative fee will be charged at the time of payment.

(Important Notes)

- Please make sure to click “Submit” to finish the process. Be noted that you cannot change the contents of the application after you complete it.
- You do not need to send anything via postal mail at the stage of applying. Only those who passed the final exam will be required to submit the original copies of “Qualification Certificate” and “Official Transcript” by August 31, 2027 (JST).

B. Application Period and Due Date (JST)

Online application is available from **October 21 to November 19 (5:00 pm), 2026.**

It is necessary to complete the online registration, submit the necessary documents, and pay the examination fee for the first-stage screening via the application system by the end of this period.

C. Notes

1. You can apply for **only one** of the following programs:

- Undergraduate Program of International Social Studies
- Interdisciplinary Program of Life and Environmental Sciences
- Undergraduate Medical Science Program for International Students (only for transfer students)
- Bachelor’s Program in Interdisciplinary Engineering
- Bachelor’s Program in Global Issues

*You cannot change the program or college once you apply.

2. Incorrect entries and incomplete applications can void your application.

3. If you need any special consideration for study due to disabilities or other issues, please contact us before the application period.

4. Application documents will not be returned and examination fees that have been paid will not be refunded.

5. **If any falsification, fabrication, or factual discrepancies are found in the application materials, or any examination misconduct is identified, admission may be revoked before or after enrollment.** Any editing or alteration of the photograph uploaded to the application system may be regarded as misconduct. In serious cases, any such misconduct may be reported to the police or may be subject to legal action.
6. If you are **not able to meet applicant eligibility** by August 31, 2027 (JST), your **admission will be revoked.**
7. For all of the documents uploaded to the application system, the **university may ask the applicant to send the original documents** if needed. Please keep the originals with you.

VII. Announcement of the Screening Results

A. First-Stage Screening

- The examinee numbers of successful applicants will be announced on the Undergraduate Admissions website (<https://ac.tsukuba.ac.jp/en/>) on **February 10, 2027, at 10:00 am (JST)**.
- Successful applicants from the first-stage screening must pay the fee for the second-stage screening (JPY13,000 for first-year admissions, and JPY23,000 for transfer admissions) via the application system within the designated payment period.
 - *Details about the second-stage screening will be announced together with the first-stage screening results.
 - *Applicants who have not completed the payment procedures cannot proceed to the second-stage screening.
 - *If an applicant has not paid the fee by the due date, he/she will be regarded as declining the offer of second-stage screening.
 - *To those who completed the payment, information about the interview date/time will be announced later.

B. Second-Stage Screening

- The examinee numbers of final successful applicants will be announced on the Undergraduate Admissions website (<https://ac.tsukuba.ac.jp/en/>) on **March 25, 2027, at 10:00 am (JST)**.
- The “Letter of Acceptance” and the other documents necessary for admission procedures will be sent to the final successful applicants.

VIII. Admissions Procedures

A. Period for Admission Procedures

1. The period for the procedures is **from April 5 to 19, 2027 (JST)**.
2. You need to complete the admission procedures within the above period.
 - *There are some documents to be sent via postal mail while the other items need to be registered on the online admission procedures website. More details will be sent along with the Letter of Acceptance.

B. Admission Fee and Tuition Fee

1. The admission fee is JPY282,000.
2. The tuition fee differs depending on whether you are an international student or not.
 - Tuition fee (For international students)
 - Fall Semester (October – March): JPY 304,400
 - Spring Semester (April – September): JPY 304,400

(Annual: JPY 608,800)

- Tuition fee (Non-international students)

- Fall Semester (October – March): JPY 267,900

- Spring Semester (April – September): JPY 267,900

- (Annual: JPY 535,800)

*International students refer to individuals residing in Japan under the 'Student' residence status as specified in Table (4) of Appended Table I of the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act (Cabinet Order No. 319 of 1951).

*This program begins in September. Therefore, tuition fees will be charged starting from September, when your enrollment officially takes effect.

3. If any fees are revised at the time of admission or during enrollment, the new amounts will be applied from the time of revision.
4. Tuition should be paid by bank transfer through a Japanese financial institution in May (first period) and November (second period) from the Spring Semester in the following year after your enrollment.
5. The university offers a full or partial tuition fee waiver for those students who are deemed to find it difficult to pay the tuition for financial reasons or who are in other unavoidable circumstances.

IX. Disclosure of Information about Entrance Examinations

X. Handling of Personal Information

The University of Tsukuba is committed to the proper management of personal information in accordance with the "Act on the Protection of Personal Information" and the University of Tsukuba's Personal Information Protection and Management Regulations.

The names, date of birth, genders, and other personal information of applicants and examinees at the time of application and admission procedures will be handled strictly and used for the following purposes.

- Selection, announcement of successful candidates, and admission procedures
- Post-entrance services for successful applicants, including academic affairs (student registration, academic guidance, etc.), student support (health management, scholarship applications, etc.), and tuition fees
- Research, analysis and study for improvement of admission selection methods, etc., and public relations

2027 University of Tsukuba Student Support Scholarship “Tsukuba Scholarship” for Undergraduate Students in English Programs

The University of Tsukuba offers the following scholarships in faculties offering English Programs.

Only students who have applied for English Programs can apply for this scholarship.

1. University of Tsukuba Student Support Scholarship “Tsukuba Scholarship”

The scholarship is provided for students with outstanding academic records. Eligible students will be selected from applicants who have passed the entrance examination for each program and also from university students who are currently enrolled in the program. The details of the scholarship are as follows:

Application Qualifications and Conditions

Applicants for this scholarship must fulfill the following conditions:

- (1) Nationality: Applicants with non-Japanese nationalities.
- (2) Applicants who, upon entering the University of Tsukuba, do not receive nor expect to receive a scholarship or scholarships from any other scholarship-granting organizations or bodies for the purpose of studying abroad.
- (3) As a general rule, applicants who are certain to obtain a “Student” visa before entering Japan.
- (4) Applicants who fulfill the qualifications for entering the Degree Programs in English in any of the following undergraduate schools:

- Undergraduate Program of International Social Studies, School of Social and International Studies
- Interdisciplinary Program of Life and Environmental Sciences, School of Life and Environmental Sciences
- Medical Science Program for International Students, School of Medicine and Medical Sciences

Scholarship Amount

A living allowance of ¥60,000 per month (From September 2027 to March 2028)

Selection Process for Scholarship Students

Year of Initial Admission: Selection is based on entrance examination scores, etc.

From successive years: Selection is based on the previous year’s grades during enrollment, etc.
